#### **MAKING DISCIPLES TRAINING: TIPS FOR BEING A FACILITATOR**

# **Getting Started**

- Trust the Lord in every way to equip and enable you to accomplish His will. Christ will receive the glory through your faithful obedience to Him.
- Ask the Lord to reveal to you those people He wants you to invite to the Making Disciples training
  and to prepare their hearts to receive the invitation.
- Because the Lord wants to be involved in your endeavors, ask Him to reveal to you the best date/time to begin and the best place to hold the class.

### The Invitation

- Extend an invitation to people in person or via email, requesting they pray about the 12-week commitment. Let them know that the training and all materials are free of charge; they will want to bring their Bible and something to write with each week. (A sample email invitation is available on the Training page of the website.)
  - NOTE: If your invitees haven't responded in a reasonable amount of time, you may consider following up with a phone call or text to confirm they received your invitation.
- Once class members have committed to taking the training, pray for them, asking God to:
  - o draw them closer to Himself,
  - o enable them to attend each week
  - o give them the desire to apply what they are learning, and
  - o bless their obedience to Him.

# The Sessions

- Pray consistently for God to cover every detail of the class and for His presence to be evident.
- A few days before each class, email each class member that week's outline and lesson application for them to print and bring to class. (Or instead, as a courtesy, you may print these documents for them to have when they arrive.)
- Arrange the room seating so that each person will be able to have a clear view of the screen.
   Depending on the size of your group, you may need to display on a TV screen rather than watch class on a computer.
- To create a genuine community, be sure to introduce class members to each other.
- Also, consider meeting for an additional 20-30 minutes following the training each week to ask what
  people learned and discuss how each person plans to put the principles into practice.

# Remember

- As a facilitator, you are not responsible for teaching. If a person asks a question, point them to biblical truth. If the question will take too long to fully answer, feel free to follow up after class is dismissed. - While you may feel responsible to "host," free yourself up from providing food each week; after all, the main purpose is to be focused on Christ.

- Pray that each person will persevere throughout the training. When a class member misses, reach out to understand why.
- Encourage class members to avoid becoming overwhelmed, but instead, focus on the enormous blessings of walking in obedience to Jesus one step at a time.
